# Greetings and Happy New Year from the Clerk's Office!

In November 2022, Michigan voters passed Proposal 2 which amended the State Constitution to include additional voting rights and protections, as well as created additional voting options. Michigan voters now have three options to vote: In-person on Election Day, Absentee Voting, and the newest way to vote is Early Voting.

#### **2024 ELECTION DATES**

Presidential Primary Election – February 27, 2024 Primary Election – August 6, 2024 General Election – November 5, 2024

# **EARLY VOTING – NEW!**

Michigan voters now have the right to vote early in person at an Early Voting site for 9 consecutive days prior to all federal and statewide elections (not local elections). The Early Voting process is very similar to voting on Election Day – show up, complete a voter application, mark your ballot, and place it into the tabulator. The election equipment, ballots, and tabulator will be secured every night; however, the results will not be tabulated until after the close of polls at 8:00 p.m. on Election Night.

Early Voting will be available beginning with the Presidential Primary election in February 2024 and every federal and statewide election thereafter.


The City of Gibraltar's Early Voting site is located at the Gil Talbert Gibraltar Community Center, 29340 S. Gibraltar Rd., and will be available for 9 consecutive days prior to all federal and statewide elections from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

For the 2024 Presidential Primary election, Early Voting will be available from February 17 – February 25, 2024 from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

# **ABSENTEE VOTING**

Michigan still has no-reason absentee voting; meaning any registered voter can request an absentee ballot to vote prior to Election Day.

The biggest change to Absentee Voting in Michigan is the addition of the Permanent Absentee Ballot List. Voters who are on our Permanent Absentee Ballot List will automatically be mailed an absentee ballot for every election. The one exception to this is for Presidential Primary elections. Presidential Primary elections occur every 4 years and are the one and only election that requires voters to select a political party-specific ballot. Voters who checked the box to be added to the Permanent Absentee Ballot List during our local election in November 2023 will receive a postcard in the mail in late December/early January and they will be required to select the ballot type they would like to



With the implementation of the Permanent Absentee Ballot option, the State will be phasing out the Automatic Absentee Ballot *Application* List. In the past, voters on this list would automatically be mailed an absentee ballot application before every election. Once this option is phased out, voters who are not on the Permanent Absentee Ballot List will have to request an application in order to receive one to apply for an absentee ballot.

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If you are not on the Permanent Absentee Ballot List but would like to be added, simply check the box on any absentee ballot application to be added. Call the Clerk's Office to receive an application.

If you are a snowbird, college student, or if you regularly use a temporary alternative address, the Permanent Absentee Ballot List may not be the best option for you as the ballot will be mailed to your home address and the USPS cannot forward ballots. The best option for these voters is to apply for an absentee ballot before each election. This way you can indicate the address you need your ballot sent to for that specific election.

#### **ELECTION DAY VOTING**

Currently, there are no changes to how we vote on Election Day. The City of Gibraltar has two precincts – both of which vote at the Gil Talbert Gibraltar Community Center, located at 29340 S. Gibraltar Rd. Polls are open on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

#### **REGISTERING TO VOTE**

Individuals are encouraged to register to vote as early as possible before an election. Methods and requirements for voter registration depend on the following deadlines:

**If there are 15+ days before an election**, individuals can register in-person at the City Clerk's office or a Michigan Secretary of State branch office, online, or by mail.

Within 14 days of an election and on Election Day, individuals may only register by visiting their local Clerk's office to register in person with documentation of their proof of residency.

## **Building Department**

September 1, 2023, we welcomed a New Building Department here in Gibraltar! McKenna has started to transition in well.

The Building Department will be on-site at Gibraltar City Hall every Monday & Wednesday morning between 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

Every 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the Month, Amy, will be in office Thursdays instead of Wednesdays.


Building Department services will also be available *by phone* Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. You can reach them at 248-938-4535.

**All ordinances** will remain the same, and you can find the new city applications in the Building and Safety section of the City of Gibraltar's website.

**Trades inspections** (Mechanical, Plumbing, and Electrical) are available on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 12pm-4pm.

**Building and rental inspections** are available Mondays & Wednesdays from 8am-12pm.



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#### Some helpful tips from our Building Official, Steve, as we enter winter:

 Please make sure you are checking all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for battery life/batteries installed. During this time, it is crucial to make sure they are working properly due to us

spending more time inside during the cold months!
Remember, Carbon Monoxide is invisible. There is no odor or color to detect when it's filling your home.
What causes Carbon Monoxide? It can be burning fuels such as different types including wood, gas, propane and even charcoal. Check your appliances to make sure they are vented correctly. If they are not, they also can cause a build up of gas in such small spaces.



- o If you haven't already, make sure you are changing your furnace filters! An old dirty filter is allowing dust, dander & possibly even mold around your home. When breathing these things in, it can cause breathing issues & worsen your allergies. Always best to try to get as much healthy circulation in your house as possible when it's winter time. All windows are shut & we are subject to whatever is being pushed around our homes air.
- Now is a perfect time to start decluttering your home. With tax season approaching, many of you can donate those items and write them off. On top of that, what a great way to maximize space in your home & organize!



• With cold weather, comes all kinds of vast weather. Rain, snow, gusts of cold crisp winds. Make sure all windows are secure and latched. Not only is it for your safety but it also can be costly, pushing the cold in and the hot air out while your furnace tries to keep up!

## **Water Department**

Water Bills are going to be billed out January 8th. They are due February 10th, 2024.

Please note, you are able to apply money on your water bill before bills are calculated and sent out. There are many residents who send in bi-weekly/weekly checks in smaller amounts to avoid "the larger" bill every 3 months. If you question why your water bill is so high, please reach out to Chelsea in the water department and she can schedule a meter check/data download to assure you do not have any unnoticed leaks/issues going on within your home.

## **Drop Box**

The City Hall payment drop box is located outside of City Hall. Water and tax payments may be dropped for payment, at any time/day, if you are unable to make it to City Hall during normal business hours. The drop box is checked daily.

If you forget to make a payment for water or taxes on the date it is due, anything that is in the drop box by 8:00am the following day will be considered as on time.

There is a United States Postal Service mail box located in front of the Gil Talbert Community Center.

# New Online Billing System and Website

The city now offers paperless billing for water bills! We have partnered with a company that allows residents to register for personal bill-pay accounts. These personal accounts offer a wide range of personalized options such as:

- Paperless billing and due date reminders
- ACH payments and auto-pay
  - Onetime payment \$1.95 & auto pay .50 cents
- Debit/Credit payments (3.25% fee)
- Text pay and text reminders
- Scheduled payments



Residents will also be able to view and pay their tax bills online. However, per the State of Michigan, it is unlawful to send tax bills via paperless billing. You may view your bill online, but a hard copy will still be sent to either you or your mortgage company. See page 12 for more online payment information.

# **Lead Line Replacement**

Per State of Michigan requirements, the city has begun working to document and replace all lead water service lines in the community. As a result, you may receive (or have already received) a letter notifying you that your residence has been identified for inspection to help meet this effort. These are brief, visual inspections that should not take more than a few minutes of your time. These allow the city to record the type of water service material present in your home.

Door-to-door inspections will be made intermittently throughout the year. A City of Gibraltar DPW employee will identify themselves to you and conduct the inspections. All identified lead-line connections will be scheduled for future replacement at no cost to you. Your cooperation and understanding in this matter are greatly appreciated.



#### **Emergency Warning Sirens**

With the upgraded technology available there will be two different distinct tones depending

on the type of emergency for the siren located at the pump house. The siren located at the pump house will emit a Fast Wail Tone in the event of a Lakeshore Flooding Emergency when the lake level reaches 72" above low water datum and a Steady Tone in the event of a severe weather emergency such as a Tornado Warning. The Emergency Warning Siren located across from the modular home community will only emit a steady tone in the event of a severe weather emergency due to the fact that Lakeshore Flooding is not an immediate concern for that area. Both Sirens will be tested the <u>last Wednesday</u> of the month at 10:00 am in conjunction with the Fermi Warning Siren. The new Emergency Warning Sirens replaced the city's old warning siren that failed and due to the age of the siren it was unable to be repaired.

# REMEMBER TO REPLACE YOUR SMOKE DETECTOR AND CARBON MONOXIDE BATTERIES TWICE A YEAR!



#### A few other quick but very important reminders:

- Do not park in front of any fire hydrant.
- Try to have a small extinguisher in or close to your kitchen.
- Do not over plug sockets in your home.
- Make sure you are cleaning and checking the lint trap in your dryer and hose leading out of your residence.
- Never leave candles burning if you go out or go to sleep.





Please make sure Fire Hydrants are not covered with snow. The fire department needs to be able to utilize the hydrant quickly in emergency situations. Hydrants can also be damaged when covered by snow plows and other vehicles.

# Go hands-free. Just drive. It's the law.

It is now illegal to manually use a cell phone or other mobile electronic device while operating a vehicle on Michigan roads. Under the law, a driver cannot hold or support a phone or other device with any part of their hands, arms, or shoulders.

Even if a cell phone or other device is mounted on your dashboard or connected to your vehicle's built-in system, you cannot use your hands to operate it beyond a single touch.

As a result, you cannot manually do any of the following on a cell phone or other electronic device while driving:



Make or answer a telephone or video call.



Send or read a text or email message.



Watch, record, or send a video.



Access, read, or post to social media.



Browse or use the Internet.



Enter information into GPS or a navigation system.

The law makes holding or manually using a cell phone or other mobile electronic device while operating a vehicle a primary offense—which means an officer can stop and ticket drivers for this violation.

#### PENALTIES

#### 1st violation

\$100 fine and/or 16 hours of community service.

#### 2nd or subsequent violations

\$250 fine and/or 24 hours of community service.

#### 3 violations within a 3-year period

Complete a drivingimprovement course.

#### Fines doubled

If a traffic crash occurs and the at-fault driver was holding or manually using a mobile device while operating the vehicle, any civil fines will be doubled.

#### Can I use my device while I am stopped at a light or in traffic?

You cannot hold or manually use a cell phone or other mobile electronic device at any time while operating a vehicle.

Operation includes being stopped at a light or in traffic but does not include being legally parked.

#### My phone is mounted on my dashboard, so I'm hands-free. Can I send a text?

You cannot use your hands to operate a cell phone or other device beyond a single touch, even if it is mounted. Use voice-activated commands instead.

# Can I use Bluetooth or my vehicle's built-in system?

You can use hands-free technology such as Bluetooth or integrated systems within the vehicle as long as you do not manually use the system. Anything more than a single touch is against the law.

# What if I see a crash or have an emergency?

A You can use a cell phone to call or text 911 to report an emergency or seek help.

# When does this law take effect?

Beginning June 30, 2023, police will start issuing citations for violating this law.




Once you click on bill pay, you will select what you wish to pay: **Taxes** or **Utilities** 

If you want to pay your water bill, once you select Utilities you will come across this box:

Your location ID is the account number that is on your bill. From there, you will be asked your method of payment. If you'd like to receive paperless billing, you set that up at this time.



#### Please Locate Your Account



When selecting taxes: Your parcel number is the 14-digit number on your tax bill starting with 36- and from there, you will be prompt to your method of payment.

## **COMMUNITY CENTER RENTALS!**



#### CITY HALL GENERAL INFORMATION

#### Tax Bill Information (2023/2024)

**2023** Winter taxes were mailed out **December 1**st and due without penalty **February 14th**. A 4% penalty will be added to the total after the due dates have passed. If you have an escrow account with your mortgage company, a tax bill will be sent to them and you will not receive one. If you believe you should receive a tax bill and did not get one, please call City Hall at 734-676-3900.



As of March 1, 2024 all unpaid 2023 real property taxes have been marked delinquent and are only payable with the Wayne County Treasurer's Office. You can view and pay delinquent property taxes at pta.waynecounty.com/ or by calling (313) 224-5990.

Personal property and Meadowlands taxes are always payable at City Hall and do not get sent to Wayne County.

# Gibraltar Infrastructure Millage

In the General Election on November 2, 2021 voters passed the Gibraltar Infrastructure Millage. This millage is at the rate of 2.5 mils for 5 years and will take effect on the Summer 2022 tax bill. This millage is a dedicated millage that will be used to repair, replace and maintain our underground infrastructure which will include water, stormwater and wastewater networks.

This is a tandem approach with our water account, as the presented rate increase of \$1.00 per unit will be going into effect for further capital infrastructure funding. As many know, infrastructure all around the county is becoming overwhelmed and is in need of repair.

The City would like to thank you for your proactive and perceptive support by putting your community first and taking the necessary steps to help fix the issues before they become emergencies.


