




Drop Box- Relocated!

The City Hall payment drop box is located right outside of City Hall, near the sidewalk walking up to the building. Water and tax payments may be dropped for payment, at any time/day, if you are unable to make it

to City Hall during normal business hours. The drop box is checked daily.

If you forget to make a payment for water or taxes on the date it is due, anything that is in the drop box by 8:00am the following day will be considered as on time.

There is a United States Postal Service mailbox located in front of the Gil Talbert Community Center.

Looking to expand your outdoor living space?

There are many ways you can refresh the exterior of your home, however there are important things you should know before taking on those projects.

Swimming pools are one of the most common additions to a backyard. Some may even think it's a simple add on, but did you know that when purchasing a pool over 24 inches deep, in-ground or above, there are guidelines within your city that need to be followed?

Before building or setting up, here are a few things you should take in consideration:

- Location
- Setbacks
- Drainage
- Flood Plains
- Pool Fences/Barriers to Create an Enclosure

Once you have investigated all those very important steps, you will have to obtain permits at your local City Hall. Many people think that just because your pool can be taken down it doesn't need to be approved by the City's Building Department. If your pool is one you can buy, set up quickly and can be set-up/taken down after the summer season has begun/ended, then yes you do need to follow the proper steps from application to completion of a permit to avoid any violations within the city.



Always consider your city's water rates when deciding on a pool. It may be a fun seasonal activity for a Michigan Summer, but it can also impact your quarterly financials. In Gibraltar, our rate is \$23.84 per 1,000 gallons. For example, if you have an INTEX pool like the one above, it will use a little over 1,100 gallons for the first fill up. This pool is on the "smaller side" and like any other pool, throughout the season, you will have to keep adding water due to evaporation, kids playing and splashing the water out and possible leakage from something puncturing it.

Chipping is done every Tuesday by our DPW. Tree branches for chipping should be left as long as possible, with the larger end of the branch facing towards the road in a neat, uniform pile. **The chipping service is not for trees cut down/trimmed by a hired contractor**. Small branches and limbs should be placed in yard waste bags.

Chipping: DPW will be chipping every Tuesday, starting April 1st!





If your trash can was broken by Priority Waste or your lid needs replaced/fixed, please visit or call City Hall. City Hall will submit a claim on your behalf once we know which one properly identifies your problem.

Pick up your flood emergency card!

The City would like to remind residents of the requirement to pick up their "Flood Cards" from the Gibraltar Police Department, if they have not already done so. The Police Station is located within City Hall at 29450 Munro Ave.

The purpose of these cards is to eliminate non-residents from gaining access to the town during flood events. During these events eliminating non-resident traffic is essential to preserving public safety and private property. Checkpoints will exist at the four entrance points to the town. Cards will be able to be hung from your rearview mirror to be highly visible at City Checkpoints to prevent traffic back-ups. For residents who may not have a card, drivers licenses indicating residency can be used to gain access.

Residents of Horse Island will receive a different color card. It is essential that traffic is limited to only Horse Island residents during a flood event.





Only household generated products from Wayne County residents will be accepted. Items that will not be accepted include: commercial waste, industrial waste, radioactive material, explosives, ammunition, 55 gallon drums, household trash, refrigerators, microwaves or other appliances, tires, yard waste, roofing shingles, & concrete.
